The Court has sentenced you to a Community Order or Suspended Sentence Order. There is a separate leaflet available that covers these sentences. This leaflet tells you about the Activity Requirement (Racially Motivated Offending) that the Court has decided that you must do as part of your sentence.

The Activity Requirement (Racially Motivated Offending) is:

- part of a sentence imposed on you by the Court
- a number of planned appointments to help you change your attitudes and behaviour

The Activity Requirement (Racially Motivated Offending) aims to:

- help you to change your attitudes and behaviour to those of a different race
- help you to treat all people with respect and courtesy
- help you to keep within the law and not commit any more offences

What you do on the Activity Requirement (Racially Motivated Offending)

- undertake 15 sessions which could last for up to 2 hours each
- work on exercises and role plays and have discussions with the Offender Manager
- make yourself available for the full sessions and co-operate with the work being undertaken
- assess your behaviour and attitudes and set yourself goals to change

When does it begin?

- When you are sentenced at Court, the Court Duty Officer will explain to you when and where you must attend
- You will have your own Offender Manager who will set up particular dates for each of the 15 sessions

You must attend

- all appointments given to you as part of this Requirement
